Start the New Year right by speaking to and urging fellow boaters, neighbors or friends to join your local Club/Squadron where they can get in on the fun of learning and camaraderie with other boaters. Winter is the time when classes are available and fun meetings and events are in full swing.

In addition, it is time to check your "Squadron Dues List" for those who may have dropped from your

membership because they have not yet renewed their dues. Drop them a note so they know the Squadron really cares about them. Remember, you can include a copy of their latest invoice to make it quick and easy for them to renew, if they have simply forgotten. (A previous member can pay their full year's dues anytime within the year after they are removed from the membership rolls and thus retain their member status.) Speaking from experience, a note from the Squadron will assure them that they are important to the group, and that they are missed. If you need assistance in finding your "Squadron Dues List," contact your Squadron Membership Chair or the D16 Membership Chair.

Also, as a new year begins, make sure your records and files are up to date. Check the Secretary's Manual (a part of the Operations Manual) for records retention information. For instance, all official meeting minutes are to be retained permanently, and all Membership Applications received should be kept on file for seven (7) years, just to name a couple of important files.
